What qualifications do you need? To practice architecture you must complete a specific architecture degree along with a period of work experience in the field. Once you've graduated, you'll need to sit an exam in the state you intend to practice in.

Every year in France, 92,000 people are placed under psychiatric care without their consent. 12 DAYS focuses on those who have been involuntarily remanded to a mental hospital, and more specifically documents the hearings that, according to a 2013 law, are required to take place 12 days after each patient has been committed.

At these hearings, the patients are given an opportunity to argue for their freedom before a judge who ultimately decides whether they will go free or return for further treatment. Granted access to these hearings for the first time, celebrated filmmaker and photographer, Raymond Depardon, captures these extraordinary encounters between justice and psychiatry, giving a voice to those who have previously been voiceless.

Encompassing questions of mental health, power, class, agency, and the dynamics of societal institutions, 12 DAYS is consummately controlled yet suffused with empathy and compassion.

CHOLESTEROL, THE GREAT BLUFF

For more than six decades, doctors, nutritionists, and public health officials have been waging a war against high cholesterol in an effort to fight heart disease. It's a war that has seen the demonization of saturated fats, the rise

and fall of hydrogenated oils, and the introduction of several generations of "miracle" drugs.

But what if the basic premise linking cholesterol and heart disease is wrong?

CHOLESTEROL, THE GREAT BLUFF convincingly argues that the link between cholesterol and heart disease is tenuous – and that its persistence results from a potent mix of bad science, entrenched interests, and pharmaceutical profits.

The problems date from the earliest days of the cholesterol hypothesis, first proposed by physiologist Ancel Keys, who proposed that a diet high in saturated fat leads to cardiovascular disease. Medical journalist Dr. Dominique Dupagne cites evidence that Keys cherry-picked his data. But it was too late. Americans were trying to understand what lay behind the soaring rate of heart attacks, and fat seemed like the perfect villain. Once saturated fats were to blame, heavily industrialized products such as "pure vegetable shortening"—the result of a process including emulsification, bleaching, and steam-cleaning—came to be seen as healthier foods.

As the film makes clear, researchers who made any serious attempt to study other hypotheses—that sugar led to vascular disease, for instance—found themselves threatened, their research funding cut and their careers derailed.

CHOLESTEROL, THE GREAT BLUFF deploys an array of authoritative and engaging experts to attack the foundations of the cholesterol hypothesis. Author and nutritionist Sylvain Duval uses markers and easy-to-understand analogies to explain the mechanisms of how cholesterol works and how the body uses different fats. Investigative journalist Nina Teicholz lays out how Keys came to demonize cholesterol, and details the intimidation faced by those who sought alternatives. Cardiologist and nutritionist Dr. Michel de Lorgeril, who did the first study on the benefits of the Mediterranean diet, is scathing in his views on the pharmaceutical industry's complicity in propagating faulty research, including the studies that led to the widespread adoption of statins. The film also hears from an array of other researchers, physicians, and writers who, among other things, question the notion of "good" and "bad" cholesterol.

Peppered throughout are vintage and recent clips from advertising (including Tom & Jerry pushing margarine), sponsored films, and newscasts blaring the latest cholesterol breakthroughs.

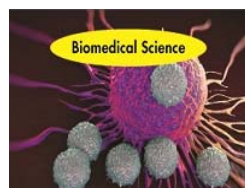

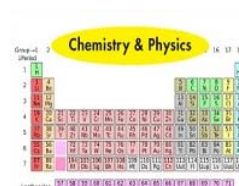

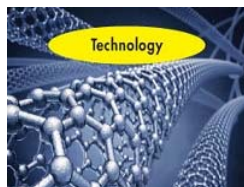

DONNA HARAWAY: STORY TELLING FOR EARTHLY SURVIVAL

Feminist thinker and historian of science Donna Haraway is perhaps best known as the author of two revolutionary works: the essay "A Cyborg Manifesto" and the book Primate Visions. Both set out to upend well-established "common sense" categories: breaking down the boundaries among humans, animals, and machines while challenging gender essentialism and questioning the underlying assumptions of humanity's fascination with primates through a post-colonial lens.

DONNA HARAWAY: STORY TELLING FOR EARTHLY SURVIVAL features Haraway in a playful and engaging exploration of her life, influences, and ideas. Haraway is a passionate and discursive storyteller, and the film is structured around a series of discussions held in the California home she helped build by hand, on subjects including the capitalism and the anthropocene (a term she "uses but finds troubling"), science fiction writing as philosophical text, unconventional marital and sexual partnerships, the role of Catholicism in her upbringing, humans and dogs, the suppression of women's writing, the surprisingly fascinating history of orthodontic aesthetics, and the need for new post-colonial and post-patriarchal narratives. It is a remarkably impressive range, from a thinker with a nimble and curious mind.

Haraway and filmmaker Fabrizio Terranova (who we hear but don't see) are clearly at ease with each other, giving the conversations—which are punctuated by images of artwork and quirky animation—a casual, intimate feel. Terranova makes playful use of green screens to illustrate Haraway's words, or to comment on them. As Haraway discusses storytelling, we see an image of her in the background, writing. When the conversation turns to her own unorthodox personal relationships and the oppressive power of heteronormativity, the redwoods out her window are replaced by a crisp suburban street. Underwater invertebrates, one of Haraway's fascinations, float by in the background of a room.

DONNA HARAWAY: STORY TELLING FOR EARTHLY SURVIVAL is a clever and insightful glimpse into the thought of a major contemporary figure.

DOUBLE LIFE, A SHORT HISTORY OF SEX IN THE USSR

By Inara Kolmane

The October Revolution that ushered in the creation of the Soviet Union wasn't just about politics—it was also about sex.

DOUBLE LIFE tells the story sex in the USSR, from the libertine 1920s, through Stalin's Soviet-style puritanism, all the way to the sexual revolution of the late 1980s under Gorbachev. Writer-director Inara Kolmane is our guide to the weird and often troubling world of Soviet sexual mores. A world where young women were taught nothing about sex but learned how to strip down a Kalashnikov, and where nearly every copy of a tame sex manual for young married couples wound up being fed into a giant furnace. Kolmane travels across the former USSR—from Riga to Siberia and from St. Petersburg to Kiev—meeting sexologists, historians, doctors, artists and ordinary citizens. They share intimate personal stories and shed light on the way attitudes towards sex shaped everything from birth control policy to fashion to employment prospects.

The early years of the Revolution saw the overthrow of bourgeois morality: workers in the new communal homes shared everything (from sexual partners to underwear). The "glass of water" theory held that satisfying sexual desires should be as easy as having a drink of water to quench your thirst. Poet Vladimir Mayakovsky made appearances with naked women draped only in sashes reading "Down with shame!" But it didn't take long for this libertinism to lead to the policing of women's sexuality. The new Soviet Man had the right to fulfill his sexual desires – and any proletarian woman who refused him risked being branded a member of the petty bourgeoisie.

It all ended under Stalin. Homosexuality, adultery, abortion, masturbation, and pre-marital sex all became illegal. When Khrushchev denounced the Stalinist cult of personality he also began a thaw in sexual policies; adultery might cost you your job, but it would no longer get you sent to a work camp in Siberia. (Highly placed party members, of course, could pretty much do what they wanted.)

In the post-Brezhnev era, legal constraints on sexual activity might still be on the books, but young people were doing it at beaches, on stairwells, in the bathrooms of communal houses, and elsewhere. By the late 1980s, a Russian model would be on the cover of Playboy.

What makes DOUBLE LIFE stand out is the conjunction of historical overview and

personal stories. A judge who presided over the trials of gay men reveals his own homosexuality in his journals. A journalist pores over the minutes of party members' meetings about his father's affair with the woman who would become his mother.

The film uses beautiful stop-motion animation to illustrate key moments in the story, along with remarkable and candid photos by Siberian photographer Nikolai Bakharev, the rarely seen pornographic drawings of legendary director Sergei Eisenstein, and archival footage from seven decades of sexual life in the USSR.

FRANCE (LES HABITANTS)

By Raymond Depardon

The vintage camping trailer making its way along France's secondary highways looks utterly unremarkable. But once Raymond Depardon parks it—in front of stores, businesses, and town squares across the country—it become the location for dozens of remarkable conversations.

Through his documentary films and photography, Depardon is known as one of the great chroniclers of contemporary France. In FRANCE, he takes a new approach: he mics his trailer, installs cameras pointed at a small table by the window, then invites strangers to come in and have a conversation with each other. (Depardon himself is never on-camera.) The participants range in age from their teens to their 80s: couples, friends, parents, children.

Despite, or perhaps because of, the unusual setting, many of the conversations are strikingly intimate. A young man talks to his girlfriend about how

he struggles with her jealousy. A single mother working as a stripper vents all her frustrations to a near-silent friend. Two high school seniors reminisce about their school days in a scene straight out of a coming-of-age film. A mother tries to make her son understand how his destructive behaviour affects the whole family and causes endless worry.

Some of the conversations feel like near-perfect one-act plays, like the one with a middle-aged couple (he's a fortune-teller, she's a self-described rationalist) who start off talking about holiday plans and end up wondering why they are together.

FRANCE does not set out to offer a definitive overview of French life. But certain themes do emerge, including women who find themselves in difficult relationships or chasing after exes for child support; parents worrying about their adult children and feeling left out of their lives; young men with appallingly retrograde attitudes towards women; and young couples who face challenges with trepidation but also who clearly delight in each other's company.

FRANCE is an immensely compelling documentary, plunging us unfiltered into the lives of a wide range of people we would not otherwise encounter.

MAN'S PLACE, A

"I've always liked to be in charge. Suddenly, I wasn't in charge at all."

The film starts with an empty chair and a simple, monochromatic background. Over the next hour, five men ranging in age from their twenties to fifties sit in the chair and look into the camera—or deliberately away from it. They talk about unexpected pregnancies: how they reacted on learning a partner was pregnant, the complex feelings that arose, and the lasting effects on themselves, their partners, and their relationships.

One man is shocked to learn his girlfriend wants to keep the child, and she is equally shocked to realize he expects her to have an abortion. After a midlife crisis, a man feels conflicted when he learns his girlfriend is pregnant, just as the two are about to break up. And a young man who pressures his girlfriend to have an abortion—he thinks she's trying to stick

him with raising someone else's baby—now feels guilty because he realizes how much she wanted the child. The film shifts among stories, never losing the thread of each as the men remember a pivotal period in their lives.

With A MAN'S PLACE filmmaker Coline Grando has deftly made an absorbing, intimate documentary on a politically polarizing subject. This is not a film about men's rights, nor does it in any way argue men should have a veto on what their partners decide. Instead, it interrogates the experiences of men, including their sometimes reprehensible actions towards their girlfriends. Grando is never on screen, but she is a presence in the film. We hear her asking probing questions, pushing her subjects to go deeper in their reflections. In one case, she questions a man's dismay that staff at a family planning clinic represented a "stereotypical feminism," in another she pointedly asks about the man's role in using contraception.

A MAN'S PLACE is a valuable film about abortion that manages to avoid the tired arguments of the abortion debate, while giving men an opportunity to talk about a subject many have never been able to discuss.

In a mosaic of intimate portraits, ordinary Russians—both young and old—speak openly about their traumas, rooted in a violent history. Tales of pain alternate with tales of pride. Nostalgic stories of a state flourishing under the Communist ideal contrast with painful memories of hunger, violence and betrayal. Not infrequently, these conflicting views can be found in one and the same person. Gradually, this intriguing film exposes how the Soviet past lives on in current generations, and thus makes its mark on the future.

SACRED WATER

"If a lot of water flows, the town will be flooded. The water company can close down. We have all the water we need." -Fanny, guest on Flash-FM in Rwanda

Vestine Dusabe is a radio host and sex educator with a mission: promoting sexual pleasure and preserving Rwanda's culture of female ejaculation.

SACRED WATER follows Dusabe as she takes calls on her late-night radio show (including one in which a woman has a very vocal orgasm), speaks to school-girls about ejaculation and female pleasure as central to Rwandan culture, and addresses a crowd on International Women's Day to discuss orgasms.

Rwandan legend has it that female ejaculation originates with an ancient queen who experienced earth-shaking orgasm while her husband was away at war, producing enough water to fill enormous Lake Kivu.

In SACRED WATER individual men and women, teenage girls, and couples discuss women's orgasms frankly, often with a strong dose of humour - a guest on Dusabe's radio show refers to the clitoris as "the Eiffel Tower." Women say men enjoy and expect them to ejaculate, and that "finding the water" guards against infidelity. Men see women's ejaculation as a sign of their prowess, and a way to make sure they are pleasuring their partners. A male doctor who has just met with a patient complaining that her water has dried up, compares good sexual skills to

playing guitar, and the process of love-making to a soccer match: "You need fair play so both sides can score." Meanwhile, girls learn about the practice of *gukuna*—stretching the inner labia—and some wonder if it is a sin. (Not surprisingly, Dusabe has strong opinions on the subject.

In interviews on the street, in couples' homes, and—perhaps most memorably—in a swimming hole, men and women share their thoughts and experiences with *kunyaza*. The filmmakers cleverly intersperse shots that are evocative but not explicit throughout the film: men straining as they row across a lake, water rushing over rocks, people jumping into a pool and engulfed in splashes, young men and women sweating as they work out in a gym.

SACRED WATER is a refreshing, fun, and honest documentary about sex, relationships, and the particularities of Rwandan sexual culture.

SILENTIUM: FROM LIFE IN THE CONVENT

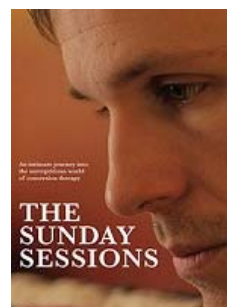

The filmmakers had unfettered access to individual therapy sessions, family sessions, and a collection of weekend camps, and have crafted an emotional and psychological thriller which chronicles two years of Nathan's journey from acceptance to skepticism, all leading to a profound epiphany.

WHEN BANANA RULED

Bananas are everywhere: Americans eat nearly 10 billion of them per year, consuming more pounds of bananas than apples and oranges combined.

WHEN BANANA RULED tells the story of the men who made bananas the most ubiquitous fruit in the world, through a multinational empire that dominated production and sales, overthrew governments, and created a business model still largely used by today's tech giants.

The story of bananas as commodities begins with a failed railway project started in Costa Rica in 1871, led by American Minor Cooper Keith. When the Costa Rican government defaulted on its payments to Keith for its construction, the businessman faced ruin. His salvation? Bananas. Keith would go on to co-found the United Fruit Company and within decades—after a concerted campaign led by the father of public relations, Edward Bernays—bananas became a staple of the North American diet. Animated mascot Miss Chiquita Banana was a pop culture icon, doctors recommended bananas as an ideal food for children, and bananas popped up in movies and Broadway musicals.

But, as WHEN BANANA RULED documents, the entire enterprise was built on a rapacious, imperialist business model that required the domination of countries including Guatemala, Honduras, and Colombia. United Fruit took over critical national infrastructure like railways and ports, rapidly expanded plantations by displacing small (often Indigenous) farmers, bought itself favorable legislation, and, like today's largest companies, sheltered profits offshore to avoid taxes.

Life on the plantations was a world within a world: A strict hierarchy with white managers from the best business schools,

foremen from the US South (recruited for their knowledge of slavery), and black laborers paid largely in company food coupons and strictly forbidden to unionize. When a new, revolutionary government was formed in Guatemala, United Fruit's plantations were nationalized. What happened next came straight from the playbook that would dominate US foreign policy in the region: claim a Communist threat, persuade legislators back home of its dangers, bomb the country, and install a new, pro-American and pro-business regime.

Using a rich trove of archival footage and documents, including letters to and from lobbyists, telegrams, vintage ads and movie clips, and gorgeous, hand-tinted stills, WHEN BANANA RULED is a story of intrigue that touches on economics, international politics, the history of multinational business and reveals how an array of forces conquered the world through a simple fruit.

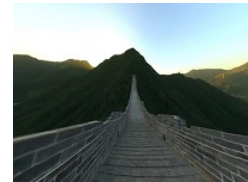
